## Working Together to Transport our Community

While the cost of using the Rapid Transit System is often more affordable than other forms of transportation, there are still some in our community who need a little help purchasing tickets or passes to get where they need to go. In an effort to support these valuable members of our community, RTS works along side our partners to operate a voucher program. This program allows an organization to provide the rider with a paper voucher. The rider can then redeem their voucher in exchange for a bus pass or ticket. The Rapid Transit System simply bills the organization at a later time allowing for riders to get the transportation they need without delay. In addition to the voucher program, RTS allows organizations to purchase tickets in bulk so that they always have them on hand in case of an emergency. The voucher program and the bulk purchasing options allows RTS and community organizations to work together in an effort to support those in Rapid City who need just a little extra support. #### **Did You Know? Youth Ride Free Program Edition**

- The Youth Ride Free Program began in the 2016-2017 school year which makes it 7 years old.
- This program allows all riders age 18 and under or those still enrolled in high school to ride the fixed route bus free of charge.
- Any youth using the system should register for emergency contact purposes. Registration is easy and can be done in person or online.
- Infants, toddlers, preschoolers, elementary students and middle school students do not need to show any ticket, pass or ID to ride. High school students should always be prepared to show their school ID.
- Since its first day, Rapid Ride has provided over 500,000 free youth trips.
- The Rapid Transit System does not receive any additional funds to pay for the program, nor did they increase fares to offset the loss.
- Rapid Ride provides free travel training to help youth learn to navigate the system.
- RTS staff is available to schools to provide group travel training sessions or as guest speakers for educational purposes.
- At the beginning of each school year, RTS provides a period of time for parents to ride for free to help guide their children.
- While the initial intent was to increase school attendance, so many other benefits have come
  from this program. Youth are able to ride to and from anywhere along the fixed route which
  allows them to be independence, participate in extracurricular activities, gain employment,
  access food when needed and get transportation to a safe place in emergency situations.

### **Busing on the Lookout**

Bussing on the Lookout or BOTL is a program affiliated with Truckers Against Trafficking that works hard every day against the human trafficking epidemic. The Rapid Transit System is proud to be a part of this vital program. All transit staff including drivers, dispatchers, administration, maintenance and management have been trained by Truckers Against Trafficking on how to identify and assist any persons that is a suspected victim. RTS has firm policies in place and all new employees are trained within their first week on the job. In addition, staff receive yearly re-trainings with the most up to date guidance.
